## 1. Art and Letters Project 2022-23

Our branch members were most enthusiastic about another joint writing/painting project where the writers will choose an artwork to inspire them, and the painter/artists will choose a piece of writing to inspire a new visual creation.

How it will be structured: It was suggested by Cyndy Falcoff that the written pieces be collected, and the titles put into a hat from which the artist will choose one to use as inspiration. The artwork submitted will be done in the same fashion. The titles of the paintings will be placed in a hat and each writer will pull one out to use for inspiration. Artists and writers will not know which piece they will be getting. However, structuring the project this way will allow for more written work and more visual pieces to be part of the project. There will be do duplicates for each piece. It will also challenge us to push beyond what comes easy to us. The written pieces and jpgs of the artwork will be posted on our Diamondstatepenwomen.org website for reference. I am hopeful that a show featuring the new work and the inspirational writing and artwork will result from our efforts. We can talk about the project more and make more decisions about it at our November 12th meeting so please come and share your ideas.
